


EMERGENCE OF SUSTAINABLE INDUSTRY

In today's market, everyone is moving towards sustainability. This is the new feature which attracts shoppers to buy. Everyone is showing concern for the environment and it is our responsibility to save our planet, Earth. The best possible way is to be plastic conscious. It means to understand that you are using plastic which is harmful to our planet as it is non-renewable and is very difficult to re-use. So, you consciously choose substitutes, for example, jute bags, cloth bags or getting polybags personally, i.e., the old ones that are kept at home and refuse to take new ones from the shop.

According to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)'s Marine Debris Program, the quantity and range of plastic waste found in the marine environment have expanded with the increasing use of plastics in our society. Daily items like plastic bags, polystyrene foam glasses and plates, plastic balloons (these fall under domestic plastic), industrial plastic and common items used in fishing (nets, buoys and traps) often enter oceans and other marine environment because of various reasons – be it improper management of waste or illegal dumping into water bodies. Once it enters the ocean, plastic can take almost 500 years to biodegrade. This awareness has led to the development of a sustainable industry which deals with eco-friendly products, for example, Bio-Lutions, they offer sustainable packaging and disposable tableware solutions made of agricultural residues, Green Mart, they market pollution free products, which are compostable and biodegradable, etc.

In the end, it is safe to say that there are people who are trying to save Earth, but the question is are you one of them? Are you conscious of the plastic waste you are generating? Are you choosing to use its replacements?




LEAN PRODUCTION

In today's world, the knowledge of how to make something is not adequate rather how to make it efficiently and cost-effectively is what matters and what entrepreneurs are looking for. The production scenario today asks either to innovate or improve, and not just do, it is imperative for success.

Talking about production or simply manufacturing, managers all around the globe struggle in only one aspect, i.e., to devise the effective way of doing it. Of course, bigger companies employ more labour and invest more in capital assets, but is it the way to go?

In a 1990 publication of 'The Machine That Changed the World', a five year long, \$5 million MIT study, the ways of the Toyota Production System was researched; this was the inception of the concept of lean production, the integrated sociotechnical approach based on the Toyota Production System, still used by that company, as well as myriad others, including Caterpillar Inc. and Nike.

Lean manufacturing or lean production is a systematic method for the minimization of waste within a manufacturing system without sacrificing productivity, which can cause problems. Lean also takes into account waste created through overburden and unevenness in workloads. Working from the perspective of the client who consumes a product or service, "value" is any action or process that a customer would be willing to pay for. Lean manufacturing attempts to make obvious what adds value, through reducing everything else (because it is not adding value). Toyota Production System (TPS) is renowned for its focus on reduction of the original Toyota seven wastes to improve overall customer value, but there are varying perspectives on how this is best achieved. The steady growth of Toyota, from a small company to the world's largest automaker, has focused attention on how it has achieved this success.
