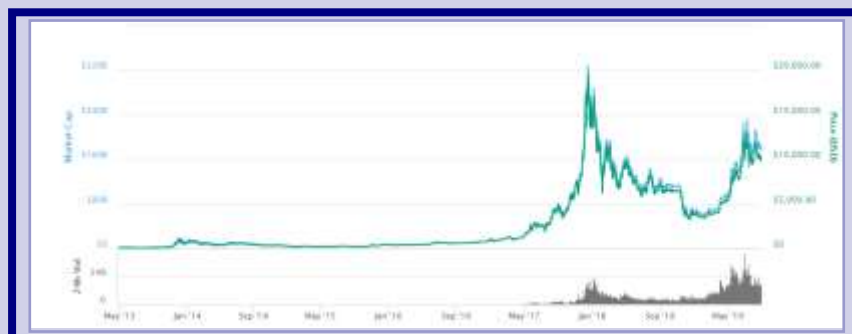


cryptocurrencies as the main mode of transaction's then you should probably wait for its price to fall.

NETAJI SUBHAS CHANDRA BOSE

Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose was a fierce nationalist, whose defiant patriotism made him one of the greatest freedom fighters in Indian history. He was also credited with setting up the Indian Army as a separate entity from the British Indian Army - which helped to propel the freedom struggle. Subhas Chandra Bose was born on 23rd January 1897, in Cuttack, Orissa Division, Bengal Province, to Prabhavati Dutt Bose and Janakinath Bose.

After his early schooling, he joined Ravenshaw Collegiate School. From there he went to join Presidency College, Calcutta and was expelled due to his nationalist activities. Later, he went to University of Cambridge, U.K.

From a young age, Subhash Chandra Bose had the Nationalist Temperament and the Britishers' discrimination would fill him with rage. To serve the country, he joined the Indian National Congress. Bose's selfless contribution to India's Independence Movement and organizing and leading the Indian National Army is indispensable. His struggle for Independence was highlighted during the Civil Disobedience Movement for which he had even been arrested. In fact, he was imprisoned 11 times for his ideologies and the use of force against the British. Bose was elected the president of the Indian National Congress twice but he resigned from the post as he was against the Congress internal and foreign policy.

Soon, he left the party and went out of the country seeking an alliance with other countries to fight against British forces. He earned the support of the Japanese and they agreed to help him in forming the Indian National Army in Southeast Asia. Later on, he became the commander of the INA. The Indian National Army attacked the North-eastern parts of India. This attack took place under the leadership of Subhash Chandra Bose and he was even successful in acquiring a few portions of the north-eastern parts of India. Unfortunately, the surrender of the Japanese forced him to withdraw and call off the war. It is believed that he died in a plane crash on 18th August 1945. Subhash Chandra Bose was an unforgettable national hero who fought for the country's freedom struggle against the British till his last breath. He is known to be one of the greatest heroes the country has ever seen!

This year the government has decided to celebrate Netaji's birthday as "PARAKRAM DIVAS".

Let us learn from him to be brave and Courageous. As he said it correctly

"Life loses half its interest if there is no struggle — if there are no risks to be taken"

NATIONAL MATHEMATICA DAY

Every year National Mathematica Day is celebrated on 22 December across the nation, in the memory of Srinivasa Ramanujan. The former Prime Minister Dr. MANMOHAN SINGH on February 26, 2012 at Madras University, declared 22 December as the National Mathematica Day for to remember the birth anniversary of Srinivasa Ramanujan.

Srinivasa Ramanujan was born in 22 December 1887 to a Tamil Bramhin Iyengar family at Erode, Tamil Nadu. He is also known as the "man who knew infinity", who did not receive any formal education in Mathematics but made huge contributions to world of Mathematics. He made in depth analysis towards solving the Mathematical problems and did so many researches for the same and had bring new concepts of solving problems in Mathematics.

The great Mathematician Srinivasa Ramanujan began his journey when to this field when he sent a letter to the Professor where he had mentioned about 120 Mathematical theorems. After that he got a call form them and joined the Trinity College few months before the outbreak of World War I. In 1916 he was awarded by the Bachelor of Science degree and on the next year he was elected for the London Mathematical Society. In 1918 he was elected a fellow of the Royal Society for his reservation in Elliptic functions and theory of numbers and the same year in October he became the first Indian to be elected a fellow of Trinity College, Cambridge.

In 1919, he returned to India sue to his poor health and a year later, on April 26, 1920, he breathed his last at the age of 32 in Kumbakonam, Madras. He was the genius Mathematician of our nation and had contributed a lot to the world of Mathematics.
